In addition to these course requirements, non-business, degree-seeking students working toward a minor should note that:

- 1. Students who elect to obtain a business minor must provide written notice of their intent to minor to the dean's office of the college in which they are receiving their degree. This notice and all requirements for the business minor must be completed prior to the awarding of the student's undergraduate degree.
- 2. All specific course prerequisites must be met. Although business minor students are not required to satisfy the entire pre-business core, they must complete the required courses and any other prerequisite course specified prior to enrolling in a 3000- or 4000-level course.
- 3. ECON 2143 will substitute for ECON 2013/2023 for prerequisite purposes (with the exception of FINN 3043). In addition, students who take both ECON 2013 (Principles of Macroeconomics) and ECON 2023 (Principles of Microeconomics) will satisfy the economics requirement of the minor.
- 4. Business minor students are ineligible to take SEVI 3013 Strategic Management.
- 5. Business minor students may complete multiple minors with the exception of General Business and an additional area of business study. Students may not use more than three hours of minor courses toward additional minor requirements.
