The pre-business GPA is not used to meet any UA requirements such as academic standing, scholarships, or graduation. *Students intending to pursue a major or minor in accounting or finance must complete ACCT 2023.			
On-campus students may take up to 35% online and self-paced online courses for degree credit. Only 2 courses (8 hours) of online may be taken in the first 30 hours. Thereafter, 12 hours of online classes are allowed per academic year. Transfer students may not exceed 35% of online and self-paced online courses for their total remaining hours after transfer work is posted.

Enterprise Resource Planning – Focuses of the use of ERP software (such as SAP) to process and manage company-wide IT transactions including the design & development of dashboards and scorecards for business managers (some web development here).

Blockchain Enterprise Systems – The technology creates an open ledger where transactions can be stored both securely and openly. The ledger is immutable, so it cannot change. It is open, so it is distributed across multiple networks, allowing people to access it anywhere. And one of the hallmarks of the technology is that data stored on the blockchain is essentially secure, so it cannot be hacked.

Business Analytics - There is considerable interest by companies in students who have Business Analytics skills. This has been most apparent as noted in the most going area surrounding "Big Data" and analytics.

CSCE 2004 Programming Foundations I is recommended as a general education elective.
