## **Accounting Course Prerequisites**

ACCT 3533, Accounting Technology (Prerequisite: ACCT 2013 with a grade of "B")

ACCT 3723, Intermediate Accounting I (Prerequisite: ACCT 2013 with a grade of "B" or better; Corequisite: WCOB 2043 or FINN 3043)

ACCT 3753, Intermediate Accounting II (Prerequisite: ACCT 3723 with a grade of "C" or better)

ACCT 3843, Fundamentals of Taxation (Prerequisite: ACCT 2013 with a grade of "B" or better)

ACCT 310V, Accounting Internship (Prerequisite: ACCT 3723)

ACCT 4003H, Honors Accounting Colloquium (Prerequisite: Senior Standing and ACCT 3723 with a grade of "C" or better)

ACCT 410V, Special Topics in Accounting (Prerequisite: ACCT 3723 with a grade of "C" or better)

ACCT 4203, Fundamentals of Taxation II (Prerequisite: ACCT 3723 and ACCT 3843 with a grade of C or better.)

ACCT 4673, Cost and Managerial Accounting (Prerequisite: ACCT 2023 or ACCT 3613 and ACCT 3723 with a grade of "C" or better)

ACCT 4963, Audit and Assurance Services (Prerequisite: ACCT 3723 with a grade of "C" or better)

Junior/Senior Business Electives (12 hours)

Selection of electives should be made in consultation with academic advisers. Students planning on taking professional examinations should ascertain course requirements by examining authorities. Successful completion of a Master of Accountancy Degree from the University of Arkansas will qualify a student to take the CPA examination in Arkansas. B.S.B.A. graduates would need additional accounting hours and other courses amounting to a total of 150 semester hours to sit for the CPA exam in Arkansas.

The following courses are highly recommended to satisfy the junior/senior business elective requirement: ACCT 310V, ACCT 410V, ACCT 4003H, FINN 3013, FINN 3103, FINN 3703, ISYS 4213 or any 3-hour Walton College Study Abroad Course. No more than six hours of accounting may be in the major.

General Online Info: You'll be able to determine the materials (textbook) needed for each course you are taking this term on UAConnect by either looking at the details of each class or through the University Bookstore. Should you access the University Bookstore's website (http://shop.uofastore.com/courselistbuilder.aspx), you will need to enter each class you are enrolled in to find a list of the materials required. Another way to view the materials needed for each course is on UAConnect. Under the "Academics" section of your student center, select "View my Class Schedule" and choose the term. At the top of the schedule, you'll see a "View Materials" button. This second method will only work if you're already enrolled in your courses.

You essentially have three lifelines during your time here at the University: email, UAConnect, and Blackboard. Please be sure to check your UARK email regularly as this is our primary point of contact with you. You will use UAConnect to manage your account information, register for classes, and monitor holds on your account. You'll then use your UARK email credentials to access your class/classes on Blackboard (http://learn.uark.edu/), where you will access all of your classes during the semester. Your courses should be visible in Blackboard by the first day of classes. If you are unable to see one or more of your classes by 5 p.m. on the first day of the term, please email your professor to request access and inquire as to when access will be given. Deadlines will be set for assignments and exams; however, you complete the coursework on your "own time." There are no scheduled virtual class meetings.
