

Comma Usage with Parenthetical and Transitional Elements

- Parenthetical words or expressions are the elements that you interject into a sentence. Because they interject, they can be viewed as non-essential and interrupting.
 - 1. The students, it turns out, were all hiding the mascot.
 - 2. The chemo therapy, incidentally, damages healthy cells as well as cancer cells.
- Transitional words or expressions are offset on either side by commas as well. They are those words or expressions that are often used to connect—conjunctive adverbs.
 - 1. Dogs, however, are not always the smartest animals on the planet.
 - 2. They are, for example, easily sidetracked.
