

# NMUN Czech Republic Position Papers Due November 1, 2015

## Position Paper Writing Guidelines: <a href="http://www.nmun.org/europe15">http://www.nmun.org/europe15</a> position papers.html

- Each committee topic must be discussed in a brief and professional policy statement that is relevant to the country being represented.
- The paper must address:
  - o International and regional conventions
  - Treaties
  - Declarations
  - Resolutions
  - o Programs of action
  - o Recommendations as to what action needs to be taken by the committee
- Format:
  - o 2-page maximum
  - o 1-inch margins
  - o Times New Roman 10pt.-12pt.
  - o Paragraph text on both left and right margins are straight
  - o Country/NGO name, school name, and committee name is labeled on page 1
  - Agenda topics labeled in sections
  - NO national symbols
  - Document is in PDF file format
  - o Do NOT have a separate paper per topic
- Other requirements:
  - Covers all topics in the Background Guide
  - o A max of 2 authors per paper
  - NOT cited like an academic paper (written as if it is a real policy statement from a foreign ministry)
  - o Must be all original writing. (NO plagiarism is tolerated.)
  - o NO re-creating any UN documents
- A delegate's role as a Member State or Observer State affects the tone of the paper. To understand the differences: <a href="http://www.nmun.org/europe15">http://www.nmun.org/europe15</a> preparations.html
- Position Paper Award judged on:
  - o Overall quality of writing
  - o Proper style, grammar, etc.
  - o Giving credit to documents/research materials within paper
  - o Consistency with constraints of the UN
  - o Analysis of issues, rather than reiteration of Committee Background Guide
