

Quotations

Commas are used to set off the quote from the signal words or phrases and the introduction of the quote. Commas following the quotation—if it is a part of the quotation—go inside the quotation marks.

- 1. The police officer said, "Get out of the car!"
- 2. "Discourses are mastered through acquisition," Gee says, "not learning."
- 3. The student asked, "Where are the books?"

If you use a quote or partial quote and do not introduce the quote or partial quote, you do not use a comma.

- 1. The student failed because she had "club obligations."
- 2. Teachers who say "not my problem" are not committed.
