One of the ways to have maximum impact on your audience is to bolster your argument through strong support. There are myriad ways to accomplish this goal.

Types of Supporting Materials

- Examples
 - Can be brief
 - Can be extended
 - Can be hypothetical
 - Use examples to clarify and reinforce your ideas
 - Examples should personalize your ideas
 - Examples should be descriptive and rich
- Statistics
 - Must be from reliable sources
 - Use them to quantify ideas
 - Explain the statistics you use
 - Use them sparingly
 - Complicated statistics should be rounded off (e.g. 238,855 rounds to 239,000)
- Testimony
 - Can be from an expert
 - Can be from a peer with personal experience
 - Should be from qualified sources
 - Quote or paraphrase accurately
 - Identify the people whose testimony you use
 - Use testimony from unbiased sources
