



#### 2002-2008 White County Natural Gas Production




### **2002-2008 White County Total Employment**




#### **2002-2008 White County Unemployment Rate**




#### **2002-2007 White County Number of Establishments**




#### **2002-2008 White County Total Wages**




#### 2002-2007 White County Average Weekly Wage




## **2002-2007** White County Average Annual Pay



## 2002-2006 White County Total Personal Income




#### 2002-2006 White County Per Capita Personal Income




#### 2002-2007 White County Goods Producing and Service Producing Employment




#### 2002-2007 White County Information and Financial Activities Employment




#### 2002-2007 White County Natural Resources and Mining Employment




## **2002-2007 White County Construction Employment**






#### **2002-2007 White County Manufacturing Employment**




#### **2002-2008 White County Sales Tax Collections**





Total Tax Collected


#### **City of Searcy Sales Tax Collections**

Note: From October 2005 to June 2006, the sales tax rate was 1.5%. During the rest of the period, the sales tax rate was 0.5%.


#### **City of Bald Knob Sales Tax Collections**






#### **City of Beebe Sales Tax Collections**




#### **City of Rose Bud Sales Tax Collections**



#### 2002-2008 City of Searcy Single Family Building Permits




#### **2002-2008 City of Searcy Commercial Building Permits**

 As of July 2008, monthly natural gas production in White County has grown to 6,000,000 MCF, 25.5% of Fayetteville Shale production.

 Since January 2002, almost 3,000 jobs have been created in White County with 59% added after January 2006.

• Since January 2002, unemployment in White County has averaged 6.2%. As of July 2008, it was down to 5.1%.

 Almost 300 business establishments have been added in White County since the beginning of 2002.

• In 2007, wage growth was 14%, better than total wage growth from 2002 to 2006.

 Average weekly wages in White County surpassed \$600 in the fourth quarter of 2007.

 The rate of growth of average annual pay doubled for 2007 from its five year average.

 Since 2002, manufacturing employment has declined by about 1,800 jobs, but overall job growth has been positive.

 The natural resources, construction, and services sectors all added employment over the period.

 The economic impact of the Fayetteville Shale shows up most clearly in the dramatic increase in White County sales tax revenues.

 The cities of Searcy, Bald Knob, Beebe, and Rose Bud have also seen clear increases in their sales tax revenues since the beginning of 2006.

 Residential construction in Searcy has slowed, concurrent with the national downturn in the housing sector.

 However, commercial construction in Searcy shows clear increases throughout 2007 and 2008, despite a national downturn.
