The Arkansas Economic Issues Breakfast Series will be held statewide at several locations from 7 to 9 a.m. on Sept. 30.

The event is designed to encourage economic development in Arkansas through the dissemination of high quality information and analysis to business, community and government leaders.

It will link people from across Arkansas via video conferencing and provides an interactive setting for learning about the latest economic trends that affect businesses in Arkansas. The video conference will be hosted simultaneously at venues in seven locations across the state.

A panel of economic experts will provide insights about how the functioning of the Arkansas economy and how the regional economies within the state contribute to the overall economic picture.

Gov. Mike Beebe will kick off the two-hour conference. The panel of economic experts includes Kathy Deck, director of the Center for Business and Economic Research in the Sam M. Walton College of Business at the University of Arkansas; Alan McVey, director of the Delta Center at Arkansas State University at Jonesboro; and Michael Pakko, chief economist and state economic forecaster for Arkansas at the Institute for Economic Advancement at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock.

They will provide insights about the functioning of the Arkansas economy and how the regional economies within the state contribute to the overall economic picture. After the panel discussion, the individual events will provide time for attendees to participate in conversations about unique local and regional economic opportunities and challenges.
