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
Overview



The State of the Northwest Arkansas Region Report is an annual publication, commissioned by the Northwest Arkansas Council, that serves as a tool for evaluating economic performance. In July 2018, the Northwest Arkansas Council created a new blueprint for development in which Northwest Arkansas is benchmarked with other contemporary, high-performing regions, namely Austin, Texas; Des Moines, Iowa; Madison, Wisconsin; Durham-Chapel Hill, North Carolina; Raleigh, North Carolina; and Provo-Orem, Utah. The 2025 report compares Northwest Arkansas with these geographies in gross domestic product, employment, unemployment, establishment growth, median household income, average annual wages, poverty, educational attainment, research and development, homeownership costs, commuting time, and average domestic airfares for the year 2024.

Jobs



Employment in Northwest Arkansas increased 2.6% from 299,200 in 2023 to 307,000 in 2024, which placed it in joint first position with the Raleigh-Cary MSA, with both having the same growth rate when compared to peer regions. From 2019 to 2024, Northwest Arkansas' employment grew at an average annual rate of 3.1%, a pace that was faster than the peer average (2.7%), more than twice as fast as that of Arkansas (1.3%) and more than three times as that of the United States (0.9%).

Unemployment



The unemployment rate for Northwest Arkansas in 2024 was 2.7%, an increase of 0.3% from 2023. The 2024 unemployment rate in Northwest Arkansas was lower than all but one peer region which is Madison MSA. Northwest Arkansas was also significantly lower than the state and national unemployment rate of 3.5% and 4.0% respectively. The unemployment rate increased 0.2% from 2019.

Real metropolitan gross domestic product (GDP) in the Northwest Arkansas region increased by 1.4% between 2022 and 2023, bringing the GDP to \$33.3 billion. The region's five-year average annual growth rate from 2018 to 2023 was 4.3%, 0.7% lower than the average annual growth rate for peer regions, 1.9% higher than that of the nation, and 1.8% higher than the average growth rate in the state of Arkansas.

Annual Wages

The average annual wage in Northwest Arkansas was the lowest among peer regions at \$59,550 in 2024. Annual wages increased at a rate of 5.3% since 2023, which was higher than the peer region's average. From 2019 to 2024, the annual wage growth averaged 4.6% per year in Northwest Arkansas, which tied the Provo-Orem-Lehi MSA for being the third-highest among peer regions. Annual wage growth was strongest in the Austin-Round Rock-San Marcos MSA region between 2019 and 2024 at 5.3%.

Poverty

In 2024, the poverty rate for Northwest Arkansas was 11.0%, a 0.6% increase from 2023. The NWA region had the second-highest poverty rate among the peer regions, behind Durham-Chapel Hill MSA. Since 2019, the poverty rate in Northwest Arkansas has improved 1.6% and was the second-fastest decline in poverty rates among the peer regions. The 2024 poverty rate in Northwest Arkansas was better than the 15.5% poverty rate for the state of Arkansas.

Educational Attainment



The percentage of adults 25 years or older with a bachelor's degree or higher in Northwest Arkansas increased to 38.2% between 2023 and 2024. On average, 49.6% of adults 25 years or older had a bachelor's degree or higher in peer regions. Since 2019, higher education attainment grew 5.2% in Northwest Arkansas, higher than the average change of 4.9% among peer regions.

Cost of Home Ownership



In Northwest Arkansas, the median home price of existing single-family homes grew by 4.8% between 2023 and 2024, up from \$346,900 to \$363,600. The rate of increase was third highest compared to peer regions. When considering the cost of housing and transportation, the typical Northwest Arkansas resident spent 43% of their income on housing and transportation, which tied for second highest, alongside the Provo-Orem-Lehi and Madison MSAs. With the exception of the Durham-Chapel Hill MSA, (highest at 44%), the typical residents in every other region had lower expenditure on housing and transportation.

Commuting

In 2024, 73.3% of Northwest Arkansas workers spent fewer than 30 minutes commuting to work, which was the second highest among the peer regions. The percentage of workers in Northwest Arkansas who used alternative modes of transportation to get to work, including biking, walking, and public transit, increased from 1.3% in 2023 to 2.1% in 2024, which was the joint 2nd lowest alongside the Des Moines-West Des Moines MSA.

Average Annual Domestic Airfare

Domestic round-trip flight from Northwest Arkansas National Airport had an average price of \$465 last year. While there's an improvement, only one other peer region had higher average fares (Madison MSA).

Academic Research and Development



The University of Arkansas had \$221.5 million in research and development expenditures in 2023, up 20.3% from 2022. The increase in funds improved the University of Arkansas' ranking from No. 138 in 2022 to No. 132 in 2023 among all universities in the United States. In 2023, the University of Arkansas received 93 invention disclosures (up from 63 in 2022), filed 47 new patent applications (down from 86 in 2022), and received 18 patent issues (up from 11 in 2022).

Business Establishment Growth



Northwest Arkansas business establishment growth from 2023 to 2024 was 0.8%, which was slower than the growth rate in all but one of its peer regions. The five-year change in the number of establishments from 13,741 in 2019 to 15,779 in 2024 represents an average annual increase of 2.8%, less than all but one peer region.




